In the name of God Amen I Thomas Stephenson of Madison County Kentucky farmer being in perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God Calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my last will and testament that is to say Principally and first of all I give and Recommend my soul in the hands of all mighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to God to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate where with it has pleased God to bless me within this life I give demise and dispose of in the following manner and form - first of all I give and bequeath to my dear and dearly beloved wife all my real and personal estate during her life after my just debts is paid Also I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Stephenson one negro boy named Peter one feather Bed and furniture and one shot to her for her heirs forever also I give my son John Stephenson Joseph Stephenson Nancy Long Catherine Patton Elizabeth Stephenson Nathan H Stephenson Nicholas H Stephenson and Thomas Stephenson an equal share of my estate except what is above willed
