In the name of God amen, I Susanna Clark of Madison County and State of Kentucky, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other Wills by me heretofore Made. - I give to my son Benjamin Clark his heirs and assigns forever, one negro woman named Betty, and her increase, which I have heretofore lent him. - I give to my grand son John Clark, son of my deceased son David Clark his heirs and assigns forever, one negro boy named Charles, all the stock of Horses, Cows, and Hogs, household furniture, and plantation Tools, which I may leave at my death, I give to my daughter Sarah Mullins her heirs and assigns forever, one negro woman named Nancy and her increase which I had lent her. - Sometime in or about the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight, I had about a bond taken to John Miller, and Robert Rodes, as Trustees to Susanna Ellis Mullins and Hutson Mullins, my grand children for the payment of a sum of money
