Health and knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die in my Seases and bound in mind I constitute this
my last will and Testament I first resign my soul to
Almighty God who gave it and my body to be buried
in a decent manner and that my funeral charges
together with my just debts shall be first paid out of my
wordly goods. Item I give and bequeath to my son
Philip Hawkins one Hundred acres of land in Garrard
County to include my former dwelling house and farm
also my two Negroes George and Beys and the old Mill
I give the Balance of my land to be sold and the money
arising therefrom to be divided equally between my four
Grand sons Henry Bright Elijah Hawkins Philip Hawkins
George Hawkins sons of Maria Hawkins Item I do give &
bequeath to my son Elijah Hawkins all my Stuffs Box and
furniture my mare cow and calf and Hogs I B considering
the best of my children to have got their parts of my Estate
Heretofore and I do will and desire that my son
Elijah Hawkins be my sole Executor Whereunto I have
set my hand and seal this twentieth day of August
