I give with my daughter Chloe ^{she is married to her first husband}
I give and bequeath to my grand son Alexis Tipton
Son of Sally Tipton to him and his heirs forever
all my estate both real and personal except save 15 for me

Lastly I appoint my grand son Alexis my
sole executor to request that no inventory may be
made of my estate & that he may not be held to account

seal this fourth day of July in the year 1807 -
