

In the name of God Amen I John West of the County of Madison and state of Kentucky being weak in body, but of sound mind and Memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same, do constitute and appoint this to be my last Will and testament in manner and form following (to wit) I recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors and Executive heirs after mentioned— Thus my will and desire is that all my just debts be paid I thus give to my son James West of five shillings to him and his heirs for ever— I thus give to my son Wm West the sum of five shillings to him and his heirs for ever— I thus give to my Daughter Permina Jackson Wife of Ferguson Jackson the sum of five shillings to her and her heirs for ever I thus give to my Daughter Louisa West wife of Marsh West the sum of five shillings to her and her heirs for ever— I thus give to my Daughter Fanny West the sum of five shillings to her and her heirs for ever— I thus give to my Daughter Rebecca West, I give the sum of five shillings to her and her heirs for ever— I thus give all the land I have on the waters of Bear Creek entered in the name of Rejiah Hancock and surveyed for the same to be equally divided between my two sons in Quantity and Quality after the death of my loving wife Sarah West to him and their heirs for ever— I thus give to my loving wife Sarah West, I give all my personal estate whatever to be hers during her life and at her death to be returned to my two sons Samuel and Peter West or their heirs for ever— also to my loving wife I give the sum of twenty dollars allowed to me by the County to be disposed of at her discretion in the use of her family Lastly I appoint my loving wife Sarah West Executive and she West Exor. of this my last will and testament

herby revoking all others heretofore made acknowledging this to be my last in writing whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal the 10th day of May one thousand eight hundred and thirteen
