Constitute and Order this my last will and Testament
and Desire to be Rec^d by all as such first my will and
Desire is that all my just debts be paid out of my
Estate by Executors that I shall appoint in this will
— Secondly I give and bequeath to my wife
Anna Anderson the whole land and Plantation
whereon I now live with all my moveable Estate to
her during this natural life otherwise one third of
said land and plantation with the one third part of
my moveable Estate During her life as mentioned above
if she my said wife Anna should die. — — —

Thirdly my will and desire is that after the Ex-
piration said Anna Anderson my Wife then the said
land and plantation whereon I now live with the other lands
that I am contemplating with George Boon and others for
if it is obtained, be Equally Divided between my sons
James, Charles, Edmund, & William Anderson. pro-
vided they do well and truly pay to my son Robert
Anderson in money or property for one Equal or fifth
part of said lands as above. — Fourthly, my will
and desire is that after the Expiration of the said Anna
my wife then all my moveable Estate be Equally Divided
between my sons Robert, James, Charles, Edmund & William
Anderson and Susannah Anderson my Daughter to
them and their heirs forever — fifthly I give and
bequeath ^{to my} Daughter Susanna Morton Twenty Shillings and
no more I do hereby appoint and ordain Robert
Anderson

and James Anderson to this my last will and Testament
in Testimony where of I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal the 11th Day of May 1803.

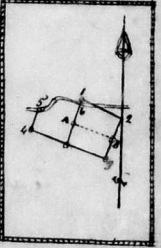
