Last Will and Testament First my Will and desire is
that all my Just Debts be paid out of my Personal Estate
by my Executor Whom I shall hereafter appoint in this
my last Will and testament Secondly I give and bequeath
to my wife Mary Woodroff all my Lands and Plantations
Whereon I now live except a small Part lying on the east
side of the Road leading from Madisons Court House to the
Clay Ferry Joining Robert Andersons land Which the said
Small tract I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Anderson
and her heirs forever ~~with~~ the tract ~~land~~ and Plantation
together with my Negroes Household furniture & all my Movable
Property during her Widowhood to said Mary and of the said
Mary Woodroff my wife should again marry then my will
and desire is that she should have one Equal Share Part of
All my Negroes & Movable Property Thirdly and as the
Expiration of the Widowhood of the said Mary my wife my
Will and desire is that my daughter Elizabeth Purkey
have all my Lands and Plantations Whereon I now live with
all its appurtenances to stand her heirs forever and no more
Fourthly my Will and desire is that after the Expiration
of the life of my Wife Mary then the Balance of

my Movable Estate be Equally Divided Divided between my
Children Viz Jane Stamped Ann Goff Susannah Porter
Eliza Anderson Tabitha Blackwell & to the Heir of my deceased
Daughter Elizabeth Blackwell Viz Susannah Brantly &
William Blackwell and to my son David Woodroff I give &
bequeath the sum of forty Shillings Current Money of Kentucky
& No more to each of them their Heirs forever I do hereby appoint
and ordain Thos. Butler & Daniel Pughl my Executors to this my
last Will & testament in WITNESS whereof I have set my hand & seal this the
Second day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand
Eight Hundred & Eight
