

James Darns, all my my lands and plantations and farming Tools Mills and Mill Tools, to be equally divided between them and their heirs forever, but be it understood if either of my sons should die without issue before he arrives to the age of twenty-one years, his part to descend to the surviving son. And my done will and direction expressly is, that all disputes shall be decided by three impartial and intelligent men, two to be chosen by the Disputants, each having the choice of one, and the third by those two, which three men thus chosen, shall declare the sense of the Testator's intention, and such decision is to all intents and purposes, to be as binding on the parties as if it had been given in the Supreme Court of the United States. Lastly I constitute and appoint my dear and beloved wife Rebecca Darns, my brother Samuel Darns and my two sons Elias and James Darns, when they come of age, Executors and ^{sees} of this Will and Testament.

In the name of God Amen. I Mary Barnett of Madison County Kentucky State, being in a low state of health but thanks be to God, I now retain my common sense and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all ones to die, do make constitute and appoint this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all Wills heretofore made by me.

I now I give and forever devise my negro man Joe, unto John Moran and Joseph Barnett, Joe to be valued by disinterested men at his real value, in cash, then to have his choice which shall be his master of the above named two men and the one that takes him shall pay the other, the one half of his price. But farther John Moran is in the first place to have the labour and benefit of Joe, until the 1st of February 1809.

My Will is that all the money which William Barnett owes me, or may hereafter owe me, shall be collected by my Executors hereafter named, to be equally divided between my daughter Jane Barnett, and her daughter Rebecca (now) Davis, and my daughter Rebecca Moore. My Will is that I have a debt instrument and also a Temperance with suitable inscription, which expresses my Will is shall be jointly defrayed for by John Moran and Joseph Barnett whom I also constitute and appoint as Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of November 1807. I Mary Barnett SS
