Then I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Rice all my property real and personal the aforesaid fifty acres excepted during her life or widowhood and it is my will that the estate be carefully kept together until her death or marriage the remaining part of my land being two hundred and twenty acres be the same men or less to be equally divided amongst my four younger sons Leabard Rice William Rice Charles Rice and Bryan Rice. Then I give and bequeath to my three daughters Sarah Rice Mary Rice and Rachel Rice at their marriage or being of age a father's bed and furniture and a cow and calf a constitution and apparel Hugh Hagan and James Rice my decision of this my last will and testament as witness my hand and seal this twelfth day of August and year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine
