Item To my Daughter Leahy Hudson I give and bequeath one cow - Item To my youngest son Alexander Elder and my daughter Polly Elder I give and bequeath the land on which I now live, a line of division to be a stream known by the name of Headers Branch, Alexander to have the farm and dwelling house likewise the said Polly is to have her saddle and a Horse and two one feather bed, bedcloaths and one cow.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy M. Hunt one bed and one small Horse etc.

Item I give and bequeath to my grandson Andrew Elder, son of Mathew Elder, one cow.

Item To my dear and beloved wife Margaret Elder I give and bequeath the use profit and benefit of my remaining estate real and personal for the term of natural life my negroes and stock of all kinds, horses, cows etc. I give to her and her heirs forever, as I also do my household and kitchen furniture to be used and disposed of as she may think proper, she is also to have her living on the land
