Agreeable to an order of the worshipful the county board of
Madison County made at their December term 1812 to us directed
appointing us commissioners to allot to Nancy Taylor her dower of
the real and personal estate of her late husband Peter Taylor dec'd
The administrators recd a division of the personal estate and
after being duly sworn to make the following report. Taking into view
the following lands &c. The tract on Tates creek whereon the
said Taylor lived and died and the improvements thereon The two
tracts on Hayes ford of silver creek and the improvements thereon
and the tract of land on the bench fork of muddy creek
adjoining to David Taylor and the improvements thereon Having due
regard to the annual value of said lands and improvements and
as one third of the same we do allot to the widow Nancy Taylor

 on the bond eight five pounds six shillings and eight pence the
 administrators Martha Cross late Martha Newland furnish two of
 her daughters Elizabeth Newland and Sally Newland Elizabeth
 21 dollars and Sally Newland 13 dollars which makes 33 dollars
 which sum is added in the above sum of 283 68 which we think
 reasonable she should be allowed for.
