Item 1st My will and Desire is that all my Just Debts be made paid off by my Executors hereafter named

Item 2nd My will is that all my Brothers, to wit, Edward Henry John and Hugh and Cabb, and My sister Peggy Parks receive the balance of my estate to be equally divided amongst them or their heirs

Item 3rd My will is that my uncle Hugh Brown take and hold the executorship of my estate, and to retain to himself a reasonable compensation for the necessary trouble he is at in the prosecution of the business. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 27th day of March 1813

At a court held for Madison County on the 5th day of July 1813 this the last will and Testament of Nicholas Brown deceased was proved to be his act and deed by the oaths of Richard Wells and Polly Wells to be his last will and Testament and ordered to be recorded

Agreeable to an order of the county Court of Madison to us directed to divide the Estate of Stephen Grandson deceased agreeable to the will of the De. of the Exors and Others concerned having declined a division of the lands belonging to the said estate the slaves belonging to the estate having been divided by the Legates Except those descended to the heirs of Stephen Grandson De. which have been hitherto allotted and reported to the court therefore it only remains for us to report a division of the personal Estate which is as follows.
