god to call on I give and bequeath in the manner & form

following first of all I will that my funeral expences be
discharged and my lawfull debts payed and my body decently
buried at the discretion of my executors second I have and bequeath
to my wife Betsey Douglass of my land with ^{my} luthers and scales
together with all my stock and house hold furniture with all my
corn and oats and the plantation clear of rent for one year
and a bond on Samuel Patton for a negro slave I will
that that elly land be sold and equally divided among my
brother and sister together with Betsey Douglass I make and
appoint elly blava friends Hugh Green & Samuell Cornuck
executors to this my last will and testament as witness my hand
this 17 of November 1808
