State of Kentucky County of Madison made in the year
of our Lord aught hundred and seven on the fourteenth
day of December In the name of god amen Samuel
Welford being sick & weak in body I signed my
soul to god & at my decease my body to be decently
interred I leave and bequeath my estate both real & personal
after my decease in the following manner Viz —
I first I will that all my lawfull debts be punctual
paid — Then I leave unto my beloved wife Elizabeth
all my estate after she has paid all my lawfull debts during
her widow hood except what I shall hereunto dispose of
then I leave unto my son William that tract of land which
I purchased from John on the other side of the river
& I will that said son make said William a house in
said land then I bequeath unto my daughter Mary
a feather bed & furniture that bed and a feather
called hers also one mare known by the name of Black
then I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph my planta-
tion with the rest of the land — I wish Joseph said son
one legacy at the end of my wife's widow hood then I direct
that period that all the remanant of my estate be
sold and equally divided amongst my children or their

lawful begetten — In Testimony of the true Execution of said
