In the name of God Amen William Douglass Sgr of Madison County and State of Kentucky being in perfect health of body and of perfect mind and memory thanks be to the Almighty God to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament That is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the direction of my Executors and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith at both pleased God to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form First after my just debts and funeral expenses are paid I give and bequeath unto my son in law

John McClain twenty acres of Land to be laid off on the East end of my tract of Land in a square plat beginning at the South east corner of said land for which said twenty acres of land ~~to be laid off~~ I have received full payment and satisfaction of him the said McClain therefore it is my will that my Executors should make him a general Warrantee deed to said Land then I give and bequeath unto my son William Douglass after his paying us three dollars thirty pounds worth of good property at its value in cash all the remainder of my said tract of Land whereon I now dwell with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging to him and his heirs forever Also I give unto my son William all my books of every sort and implements of husbandry then I give unto my grand daughter Mary McClain one feather bed and furniture then I give and bequeath to my three daughters Ann McClain Ruth Park and Alice either the remainder of my personal Estate to be equally divided among them and lastly I constitute make and ordain my said son William Douglass the sole Executor of this my last will and Testament and do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments will bequeaths and Executors by me in anywise before named will I together testifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2nd day of June one thousand eight hundred and 29 Signed Sealed published pronounced William Douglass Sgr. Co. as his last will and Testament in the presence of us who in the presence of each other have hereto subscribed our names
