In the name of God amen I David Hill being perfect in mind and memory but knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die to make this my last will and Testament in the following manner that I leave and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy Hill one good Bed and furniture and her best choice out of my stock of horse also one cow choice of my

cattle also two ewes her choice of my sheep also her choice of five head of Hogs out of my stock of hogs also five chairs her choice also one Table and kitchen furniture also all my Kitchen knives and forks and my Earthen ware also my dwelling house and land in and plantation during her natural lifetime I then give and Bequeath to my son John S Hill after my wife Nancy decease the plantation which I have already made him a deed to and also one good Bed and furniture and all my farming tools also one cow and one ewe I then give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth still two good beds with good furniture also one cow and Heifer yearling and one ewe also one falling Table one Earthen Dish and one pitcher three earthen plates and one Sattler also one spinning wheel and two chairs also one bay mare yearling I then give and bequeath unto my daughter Phanor Hill two good beds and good furniture also my black mare and colt also one horn and tackling and one spinning wheel and two chairs also one ewe I then give and bequeath unto my son William Hill one cow and Lamb I then give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Dolly Rucker one trammel head and furniture I then give unto my grand daughter Lavie Hill one heifer yearling also one ewe and lamb and the balance of my estate to be sold and when all my just debts is paid the balance to be divided between my three daughters Nancy Rucker Fanny Woods and Patsey Maupin and I do appoint my son John S Hill and John Black to be my sole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament witness my hand this 30th day of September 1811
