In the name of J^{es} & J^{es} Amos & William Lipscomb of
Spartanburgh District State of South Carolina being in my
sound mind and memory make this my last Will and
Testament this seventh day of July in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and eight and in the thirty
fourth year of American Independence I do give and
bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Lipscomb the Land where
I now live the East side of main Thickety Beginning and
small ash on the bank of the creek about halfway
between my fence and Thomas Little thus fence a straight
line to a poplar in Shapps old field above the Horse ford on
the East side of old Bee creek to continue a straight
line to ~~land to a red oak~~ Birchfields east line along
said line to his corner post oak the east side of the little
blue branch thence a straight line to a red and Black oak
Hew and Austins corner along their line to main Thickety
up thickety to the Beginning a six choice negroes and
as much stock Tools and household furniture as
she chooses to keep I do give to my son William Lipscomb
deceased children four negroes Hannah Dick Bartlett &
Cory them and their increase forever I give my Grandson
David Lipscomb three hundred dollars and he is to receive
three hundred dollars out of his father William Lipscomb dec^d

part and have an equal share share with his brother and sisters
of the balance the money to be left in my Exors hands to educate
him except so much of said money as shall be laid out in educating
him at the Latin schools before my decease. (Item) I give unto my
son David Lipscomb eight negroes viz Morris Daniel Parkin
Harrison Remy Hannah and Bartlett them and their increase forever
Item I give my son John Lipscomb six negroes Robbin Nelson
Remy Charity Moses and Peter them and their increase forever
Item I give my daughter Mary Littlejohn eight negroes Dayney
James Jacob Talley Ann Samuel Amey and Peg them and
their increase forever also a tract of Land whereon Thomas Littlejohn
now lives Beginning in Birchfields East line and running on
the North line of the above described Land to main Thickety
crop the creek a straight line to a post oak corner on the left the
right hand side of the path that leads from my house to Williams
Thompsons place thence along Thompsons line to Thomas Collins
line along Collinses line to Ropes along Ropes to Birchfields line
along Birchfields line to the Beginning (Item) I give my
daughter Nancy Wood six negroes Isaac Minn Harry
Daniel Samuel and Adams them and their increase forever
also two tracts of Land one purchased of William Wood the other
of Joseph Chapman is heres the said Nancy Wood now lives
Item I give my son Nathans Lipscomb seven negroes Biney Phoebe
Children Kelly Tom George and Asa them and their increase
forever also a tract of four hundred acres on muddy creek
Kentucky the Land whereon the said Land Nathans Lipscomb
now lives and has my bond for a flight is included the line to run
so as to not to injure the other part of my Land my son Nathans
Lipscomb to have no part of my other Land or their balance

he chooses to have his valued as all my other Lands by four
or five good men chosen by my Executors then the said Nathan
Lipscomb may take it at the valuation and draw an equal
share with all my other children then the said Nathan Lipscomb
shall receive two hundred dollars for his trouble in being after
my Lands. Now I give my son Smith Lipscomb five negroes
Ginney, Nancy, Garland, Milly and Annied then their
increase forever also the above described Land ^{and} ~~off~~ for my wife
after her death my son Smith Lipscomb to have full possession of
it all the above described Lands to be valued and then that is
on them may take them at valuation all my other Lands not
hereafter described be Lotted off and any of my children may
take a Lot or Lots at the valuation except more than one
wants a particular Lot then they may bid for it and for
choice or sell on a credit the whole of my Lands to be valued by
four or five good men chosen by my Executors my Kentucky
Lands also I have three tracts in partnership with William
Thompson known by the Line Tracts one conveyed by
William Bratton Sherk one Capt. James Martin the other we
have said Martin Bond for a Right to William Thompson is
to, half that is recovered of all or any to pay half the difference ^{from}
and have half the profits which said Lands will be sold, ^{at the discretion of my}
Executors as they may think best my son John Lipscomb to
deduct out of his equal part four hundred dollars for the
Lands deeded from me to him unless he chooses to have that
valued as my other Lands then my son John Lipscomb to
receive his equal part the negroes household furniture and
stock that my wife do not make choice of be equally divided
among my children so that the negroes remain in the family

and at my wife's death all that part of the negroes household
furniture and stock and their increase and tools that my
wife had be equally divided as my other property my will and
desire is that my wife ^{shall live with my son} Smith Lipscomb & they having the liberty
of cropping together if my children die leaving no child their
brothers and sisters shall receive their equal parts and if any
should die leaving a child or children then my grand child
or children shall receive their Father's or mother's equal part
My Will and desire is that my son David Lipscomb ~~be my~~
Lipscomb Nathan Lipscomb and Smith Lipscomb be my
executors and that my Executors do perform as above in
the presence of. have hereunto set my hand and seal the

- To one Bond on Tabitha Smith now Tabitha White due the 6th day of November 1805 6 00
- To one note due from Asa Smith of £1/15/- with a credit of \$1.50 bearing date the 25th day of June 1807 and not due 14 35
- Same on Debit of \$13.50 bearing date the 8th day of October 1811 and due on the 10th 13 50
- Same do. \$47.80 same date and on the same time 47 80
- To one Note on Joel White for \$1767 bearing date the 16th day of August 1809 and due two days after date 17 67
- To Thomas & Son and Company Bond of \$188 bearing date the 15th of Oct. 1811 due six months after date with Interest 180 00
