In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Stephenson of Madison County Kentucky Farmer being in perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God Calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul in the hands of all mighty God at his mercy and my body I recommend to God to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate where with it has pleased God to bless me within this life I give and dispose of in the following manner and manner - first of all I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife all my real and personal Estate during her life after my just debts is paid Also I give to my daughter Elizabeth Stephenson one negro boy named Peter one feather Bed and furniture and one chest to hold her's forever Also I give my son John Stephenson Joseph Stephenson Nancy Long Catherine Patton Elizabeth Stephenson Nathan H Stephenson Nicholas H Stephenson and Thomas Stephenson an equal share of my estate except what is above willed

to Elizabeth Stephenson last of all I appoint my two sons John and Nathan H Stephenson my Executors and do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and Every former Testament will legacy bequests and Executors by me and in anywise before named willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 4th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twelve Signed Sealed published Pronounced and declared by the said Thomas Stephenson as his last will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereto subscribed our names

Agreeable to an Order of the County Court of Madison made on the motion of Samuel Lackey Senr at their January Court 1812 to wit directed we have met on the 15th day of said month and being first sworn proceed to allot and lay off the dower of Jane Patton in said tract which is bounded as followeth Beginning at a white Oak the south west corner of said tract and Corner to Samuel Lackey Senr thence with the line dividing said tract and Samuel Lackey Senr East one hundred and ^{two} poles to a stake in a line above a Spring thence north 48 poles to a stake thence to sixteen poles to a dogwood thence north 59 poles to a white oak on the old line

thence with the old line west 89 poles to an elm and
small black oak the old corner thence with the old line
south 107 poles to the beginning containing sixty three
acres and one half given under our hand this 31st day of
January 1812

At a court held for Madison
