I Abalom Robinson of Madison County and State of Kentucky
being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and
memory thanks be given to god therfore calling to mind the
mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed me
for all men to die do make and ordain this my last
will and testament what is to say principally and first of all
I give and recommend my soul into the hands of god that gave it
and for my Body I recommend into the earth to be buried in
a Christian like manner at the discretion of my executor
nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall be raised
the same again by the mighty power of god and as touching
such worldly estate as it hath pleased god to bless me with in
this life I give and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form it is my will and do ordain ^{that} in the first
place I do bestow my son Abalom the way more with I give
and bequeath unto Mary my dearly beloved wife all my house hold
furniture horse cattle sheep and hogs during the widowhood
and if my wife Mary should marry then all my estate to be divided
amongst all the children except my son Isaac Robinson and to
him I give and bequeath one dollar now and will and
bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my
last will and testament in writing which I have hereunto

The last will and Testament of Simon Richard made at
the County of Madison a few days before he departed this
life when death took place on the 17th day of May 1804
the aforesaid Testator being at the time of making it
Will Sound in mind and memory and having a disposing
mind called on Joseph White and Charles White
who were then present to take notice of the manner
in which he wished his goods and Chattels disposed of
which was as follows to wit. First the said Testator
directed that all his just debts should be paid and that
the remainder of his property should belong to Polly
his wife except one black man and colt which he
wished to be sold and the proceeds arising from the sale
