I Stephen Easton of the County of Madison and Commonwealth of Kentucky being law in health but of sound and disposing mind and wishing to settle and dispose of my worldly property do make publish and declare this my last will and testament as follows to wit: First It is my will and desire that all my negro Slaves to wit Hannah and her child Betty, Lucy, Amy and her child Nancy, Franky and Daniel shall be manumitted and free from and after my decease but my Boy slave Daniel to be subject to the restriction I shall hereafter appoint. 2<sup>d</sup> It is my further will and desire that all my last debts if any I shall owe at my decease shall be paid out of my personal Estate. 3<sup>d</sup> I do give bequeath and <sup>leave</sup> unto my son Reuben Easton one half of all my estate <sup>which</sup> real personal and mixed to him and his heirs forever but not to be paid over or delivered to him in possession before the twenty fifth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and six then and during the time last aforesaid. My Executor whom I shall hereafter name shall keep and retain in his hands that portion of my Estate <sup>being</sup> devised as aforesaid to my son Reuben Easton. Further It is my will and desire that the balance of my Estate be equally divided between my other children to wit Fitz Hays John Johnston Easton Lewis Easton, Polly Easton, Robert Easton James Easton James Easton

and their heirs share and share alike— It is further my will and desire that what ever sum of money may be due me at any time from ~~my~~ <sup>my</sup> ~~or~~ <sup>or</sup> John Embury Stillman in said Embury's hands until the twenty fifth of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixteen be paid by the said Embury there for until the date last aforesaid. Further it is my will and desire that my Executor hereafter named shall act as Guardian to my afore-mentioned boy slave Daniel until his said Daniel shall have arrived at the age of twenty one years (he being now a about nine years old) and that said Daniel shall be put or bound by my Executor to the trade of a Farmer until he shall have arrived at the age of twenty one years aforesaid at which time he shall be free— I do here by constitute and appoint my good and truly friend John Embury Executor of this my last will and Testament, and I do hereby revoke all and every will and testament and every former will or wills purporting to be my last will and Testament and do make publish and declare this to be my only true last will and Testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen
