I Stephen Walker of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky the weak of body yet of sound mind and perfect understanding and memory do constitute this my last will and Testament and wish and desire it to be received by all as such
I Impressed I wish and desire all my just Debts to be paid after which I Give unto my son William Mosely Walker my Daughter Sally Walker my Son John Walker

and my daughter Judith Walker Children of my first wife Mary Walker Deceased the four after named Negroes to wit; Granderson Rebecca Rachel and Samuel to be equally divided among them at my death I also Give to my well beloved wife Lucy Walker three after named Negroes to wit; Joe, Clokey and little Rebecca also my Cart and yoke of Oxen one or one plough and Two hoes and also my land and mansion house also my house hold and table ken furniture also one mare named Maud Two Cows and Six head of Sheep and Ten head of hogs during her natural life But if she should marry I wish and desire her to have all the above mentioned property that is devised to her except the land after which I wish her to have only one third including the mansion house and immediately after her marriage should it take place I wish the remaining part of my estate to wit; Negroes horses Cattle Sheep and hogs and every species of property not otherwise devised to be sold and equally divided together with Two hundred and fifty Dollars of Bank Stock in the Richmond branch Bank between my five last Children by my last wife Lucy Walker to wit; Maria Walker Eliza Walker Lemina Walker Wade Walker and Stephen Walker It is further my will and desire that all the property I have devised to my wife Lucy Walker shall descend at her death to my five last Children named youngest Children I also wish if any money should be left that my present crop of Tobacco may be sold for after disposing my debts it should be applied to the finishing my new unfinished house now on hand I Give to my son William Mosely Walker my Rifle Gun &c also my watch &c that Thomas Bates and William Walker should execute the my last will and Testament Gettunder my hand and seal this 7th of November 1816
