the present under the affliction hand of Providence
and weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and
memory Blessed be all mighty God for the same and at
the same time considering the uncertainty of this mortal
life do make and Publish this my last will and testament
in manner and form following that is to say first it is
my will and desire that as much of my property be sold as
shall pay my just Debts and the Balance I am to remain
in the hands of my Beloved wife Nancy Hawkins if any
it is further my will and desire that my wife have the sole
use and benefit of my plantation during her Natural life

Or her Remaining my widow and then the whole of land and what property remains to be sold and the money arising there from to be divided as follows to wit my sons Wenden and John Hawkins to have Eighty Dollars each and the Balance to be Equally Divided among all my children Nevertheless it is my desire that if the money can be raised to let my son Wenden have his Eighty Dollars when he comes of age and I do appoint my Son James B. Hawkins & my Beloved wife my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament in testimony where of I have here unto set my hand and seal this fifth day of June 1815 Elijah Hawkins
