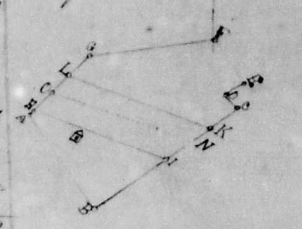

I James Jones formerly of Rockwell County but now residing in Madison County Kentucky in my common mind and memory but being infirm and unable to manage my affairs so as to give the said parties trouble in paying my debts and making distribution of my estate. I do therefore declare this Instrument of writing to be my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other writings of the kind. At the first place I wish my brother Humphrey Jones immediately after my death to take possession of all my estate both real and personal with full power to give bond or security as executor or other otherwise hereby vesting him with power to sell, lease, convey lands, attend to law suits have arbitrators appointed make compromises and do every thing and all things in settling my affairs as I could do myself and after paying all my last debts which I wish my said brother Humphrey to pay himself for his services as executor and the balance of my estate to be equally divided amongst all my brothers and Sisters except brother William Jones who I only wish should have one equal share or sixth part of the tract of land where on my Father now lives, and do further will and require that my Sisters have the exclusive right and control of their parts of my estate not subject to the payment of the debts of their husbands nor to be applied to their use in no way whatever and further it is my wish that my father should hold full possession of the land whereon he now lives during his life and further if my said brother Humphrey Jones should choose to do so he may sell all or part of my land and other estate and divide the proceeds thereof as is heretofore directed wishing that every thing may become agreeable to the true intent and
