 and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind
 and memory and considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being
 in sound mind blood be God for the same I do make and publish this my
 will and Testament in manner and for following that is say I leave to
 my eldest daughter Manning Hand one bed three cotton and calico bed quilts
 one double cover cover bed one pair of cotton shirts two pillow one pul-
 der and three plates four white dishes plates three dishes bowls four tea
 cups and saucers and a cream pot one earthen flowered pitcher and
 black Walnut chest one quailing mare colts and my will is that one
 cow and calf and one heifer two sheep and one red sow and eight pigs
 also eight hogs two iron kettles one large earthen crock with two handles
 one candle stand one ironing board one quidron one hammer and pair of
 pot hooks and one peck gallon each one crock tub also six dollars in
 cash to my son Henry Hand also five dollars in cash to my son Thomas
 Hand also my will is the property above mentioned beginning at the
 cow and calf be sold at a twelve monthy credit and when collected to be
 divided between my two sons Henry Hand and Thomas Hand all the
 money that is in the house at my death and all the corn and meat to
 be equally divided between my three children Henry Hand Thomas Hand
 and Manning Hand and I do hereby also appoint my beloved friend
 Thomas Junior my sole Executor of this my will and Testament by me
 made in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 29th day
 of February 1814

And it is further my will and desire (as I ^{have} full and entire Conscience in my said Executor) that my said Executor be not compelled, asked or required to give security for the faithful performance of the trust hereby reposed in him In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 22nd day of June 1813
