stitute this my Will and Testament and after all my
Just Debts are paid it is my desire that with what Bless-
ings the Lord hath blessed me with be Disposed of in
the following manner To wit I give to my
beloved wife all the Tract of Land I now live on and
all heretofore Estate both real and personal during
her life or widowhood and after her decease every
thing is to be sold and Equally divided between my
Three sons and six Daughters and the two Grand
Children that is now living with me which will
Name Thomas Hume Parkin Hume Stanton Hume
Elizabeth Hume Martha Hume Carlo Hume Frances
Hume Emma Hume Susannah Hume these are the
Tract and Children named Earle Funks and Lisane
Funks which is to have the one sixth part divided between
them two and either of those two Grand Children ^{do} die
before they come of Age or have Lawful heirs the other is
to have the said sixth part If both die under age and
without Lawful heirs their parts is to returne from whence
it came and is to be divided among my Sons or if any of them die under
age or without Lawful heirs their part is to returne
to be divided amongst the other Brothers & Sisters
I do give my wife the Priviledge of Giving these
Children that lives her after marriage or coming
of age household furniture or Stock if she can
Spare it and is to be valued by three disinterested

Persons I do give her Love if she sees Cause to sell
apart of the Negroes and the money to be equally divided
among my Children there is to be paid in money for the
solving of Emma and Susannah and they to be maintained
out of my Estate untill the age of Eighteen years Except
marriage Lastly I constitute my Three sons Thomas Parkin
and Stanton Hume Executors of this my last will and
Testament writing my hand and seal this Twenty fifth day
of July one thousand eight hundred and fourteen

my soul to God who first gave it secondly I wish my body buried
in a decent manner thirdly I do bequeath my just debts and
fourthly I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy
Ham all my household and kitchen furniture and all
