mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for all
men once to die do make and ordain this my last will
and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all
I give and Recommend my Soul into the hand of all mighty
God that gave it, and my body I Recommend to the earth
to be buried in decent Christian burial, at the discretion of
my Executors nothing doubting but at the general
Resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the power
of God and as touching such worldly property wherewith
it has pleased God to bless me in this life with I give
devise and dispose of the same in the following manner
and form, first I allow all my just debts to be paid
out of my estate by my Executors, Also I give and bequeath to
my beloved wife Eliza one feather bed and furniture One
beded bow and one brown and all the goods belonging to her
I own the balance of my estate I allow to be equally divided
between my wife and all of my children each having their
her equal share, also I allow the cow I purchased at Thomas
Lellards sal. to be sold to pay the money I owe for said cow
immediately viz. cash in hand lastly I appoint Zachariah
Willie Sole Executor of this my last will and Testament, and

I do hereby disallow, revoke, and disannul all and every former
testament by me in any wise before named will and bequeath
in writing and confirming this and no other to be my
last will and Testament in writing whereof I have herunto
set my hand and Seal this fifteenth day of August one
thousand eight hundred and fourteen Signed Sealed
Published Pronounced and declared by the Said James Joan
as his last will and Testament, in presence of us, who in
his presence and in the presence of each other have heard.
