 my children William Dunn Polly Holland Mary Stephens James Dunn
 Elizabeth Ford Susanna & Dunn Emma A. Dunn Except my son
 William Dunn because I have already given to him a horse & cart & he
 wife to my Daughter Polly Holland I have given a horse & cart
