one Shilling Sterling and no more.

My will and desire is that Jesse Oldham Elias Oldham
Barry Oldham Nathaniel Oldham John L. Oldham
these five last mentioned Children shall have all the
residue of my estate to be Equally Divided amongst them
both real & personal estate is my will.
