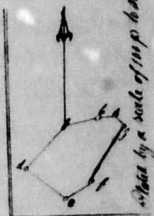

signed Commissioners to allot to the widow and relief of John Dawson
her Dower in and to the Estate of Thomas John Dawson, her son and
heir, a pomebet ourselves at the dwelling house of the Dec^d January 7th and
being first sworn by Joseph Miller a Justice of the peace, proceeded to lay off
by proper (meals and bounapher) dower to the land and Estate and then adjourned
till January 9th at which Joseph Miller for Report of surveyor and having
met agreeable to adjournment and the surveyor James Anderson having
made to us his report we do in manner and form as follows allot to Lucy Daw-
son Widow of John Dawson Dec^d her Dower to her Dec^d husband's Estate
to wit: Beginning at a large poplar tree corner to the Dec^d tract and
corner to Joseph Miller thence with Miller's line South 88° East 19 poles to making
said report part of acres and herewith filed. (Signed)

Surveyed the 7th of January 1819 by direction of (William M. Morris
and Amos Province, & Thomas Maxwell, Commissioners) to wit:
Lucy Dawson's Widow & of John Dawson Dec^d her Dower in
the Dec^d Land Beginning at a large poplar tree one of the old
corners of the Dec^d tract and corner to Joseph Miller and Joseph
Miner at A. thence with Miller's line South 88° East 19 poles to a hick tree corner to
said Miller at B. thence with another of Miller's line South 75° East 42 poles to a hick
tree another corner to said Miller at C. thence with another of said Miller's line South
49° East passing a hick and dogwood corner to aforesaid Miller at D. 48 poles in all
66 poles to a rock on the North East bank of a small stream in the field at D. thence
up the stream South 57° East 59 poles to a rock in the edge of hollow below Mrs.
Dawson's kitchen at E. thence North 54° East 98 poles passing the spring to a hick tree
on a hill side at F. thence North 30° East 76 poles to a stake on Joseph Miner's line
at G. thence with Miner's line North 38° East 16 1/2 poles to the Beginning contain-
ing in said Boundary 97 1/2 acres & 83 poles. (Signed) James Anderson (Ct. M C)



Also we allot to her the widow aforesaid a negro man named Marr who
by valuation of Commissioners does not amount to her third part of the negroes
by § 33 and 33 cents also the widow aforesaid purchased at sale of the Dec^d
personal Estate \$179.89 and the amount of sale was \$429.79 consequently
she purchased more than her third part of the personal Estate \$136.03 and her
deficunt in the negroes \$333.8 leaves her indebted to the Estate \$333.8 and on the
payment of \$333.8 we allot to her the good so purchased as one third part of the
personal Estate given under our hands & seals this 9th January 1819.

Agreeable to an order of the Madison County Court made at their October Court 1818
directing us as Commissioners to allot Henrietta Rucker's widow and relief of Jeremi-
ah Rucker Dec^d her third part of her said Dec^d husband's Estate both real and personal
to make the following report: we find that Jeremiah Rucker died seized of 445 acres
of land out of which we allot to his widow Henrietta Rucker 47 1/2 acres and bounded
as follows: (to wit) Beginning at a stone near Hugh Glenn's fence being one of the old
corners of aforesaid tract of land and corner to 55 acres sold by the Dec^d to William
Mitchell thence with the old line being Hugh Glenn's line for the 50 poles to a stake
corner to said Glenn thence with another of the old line South 88° East along
Glenn's fence 48 poles to a stake and sugar tree marked a point thence a
new line north one degree 12 and with a partition fence 44 poles to a stake in the
apple orchard fence thence with the orchard fence East 50 poles to the corner
of said fence thence with another line of the fence North 5° East 12 poles to a stake
thence through a field North 78° East 57 poles to a hickory standing out side of the
fence thence North 10° East running nearly along the fence 12 poles to a dogwood and horn
beam thence North 86° East 56 poles crossing a branch to a hickory and dogwood tree
thence South 24° East passing a sugar and ash tree corner to the aforesaid 55 acres &
with a line of the same to the Beginning. Also we allot to said Henrietta the one
third of the fruit that the orchard may produce. We further allot to said Henrietta
one negro girl named Maria and one hundred dollars to be taken out of the
Dec^d heirs part of the personal Estate to make her husband's part of the slaves equal to one
third thereof we further allot to said Henrietta seventy nine dollars and seven cents
being the one third of the net proceeds of the personal Estate as per settlement
with William Barnett the acting Administrator with the Commissioners
given under our hands this 15th day of January 1819.
