widow after her death or marriage property to be sold and the
money to be put out upon interest till my children come of age
and an equal division to be made among my children as they come of
age but it is my wish that my children be schooled and the schooling
to be paid out of the money or interest and also I wish James Belley
and William Rice to act as my Executors after my death where unto
I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 6th day of April 1814
