In the name of our Almighty God and I John Simmons of Madison County and State of Kentucky being deeply impressed with the thought of the uncertainty of life have made this my last will and Testament I give to my well dear and well beloved wife Maryanne Simmons every thing that shall be found in my possession or that may be obtained by ^{me} means only my second son by paying my lawfull debt John Simmons my dear son is to have if he or his guardian shall choose ^{so} and all ^{my debt and pay all if he shall choose} the money that is now called his property by paying twelve dollars to George Wood and to my daughter Milly I give a two Dollar cow And also I give her husband Reuben Shivers my saddle which I consider will make my son John and daughter Milly equal with my other children his (viz) John Simmons and Mary Wood.

After my wife dies my will that John Simmons and John Simmons my two sons shall have my land and all the plantation tools that may be found in her possession each to have one half by paying only silver my grand

son George he and the Executors is to sell such as can be

daughter twenty dollars and John Moore my grand son
 twenty dollars each to be paid in trade when they may come
 of full age to act for themselves but if one or both of my
 grand children should die before they arrive at full age
 My sons are to be released from paying them, And the
 balance of my Estate ^{from my wife's part} to be equally divided between Milky
 Thomas and Nancy Moore My two daughters and appears

 County of Madison and state of Kentucky being of sound mind
 and memory do make this my last will and Testament hereby
 revoking all others by me made. Now first all my lawful debts
 to be paid punctually paid then to my first eight children that
 I had by my first wife Rebecca (deceased) Andrew Thomas Edward
 Eliza Sarah Ann Sarah and Charity I bequeath one dollar to
 each of them apiece having before given to each of them such part
 of my estate as I intended them to possess. Then to my youngest
 son William I give as much of my estate as will board and
 school him to the college of this so as he may well understand
 the same and one horse saddle and bridle to be worth one hun-
 dred dollars. Then to my two youngest daughters Eliza Jane I give
 to each of them one feather bed and furniture on cow and calf
 one horse saddle and bridle to be worth twenty five pounds each
 of them. Then to my daughter Catharine Patterson I give her and
 her children the fifty acres of land they now live on to each an
 equal part. Then the plantation and land I now live on and
 all the negroes and stock of every kind that I may possess
 only such part as is above disposed of I give to my son Barnet
 the use and Control until my youngest son William arrives
 to the age of sixteen or if he shall die before that he the son
 William arrives to that age until the next youngest death.
 the negroes now to be disposed of but if the stock becomes
 too large he and the Executors is to sell such as can be

The commission appointed by the Worshipful Court of Magistrates have met on the 20th day January 1814 to appraise the property of John Simmons and proceeded as follows -
