98 In the name of God Amen I Joseph Delany of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky being in health and sound mind & memory but knowing that all flesh doth or later yield unto death & being desirous to dispose of my worldly Estate, with which it has pleased the Lord to bless me, I do hereby ordain this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me heretofore made - first I give my body to the ground from whence it was taken waiting for the day of Judgment when I must appear before the great Tribunal of God, where I hope through the merits of a blessed Redeemer to receive peace and pardon - and to be buried at the direction of my dears hereafter named -

It is my will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid -

Item It is my will that as soon as convenient after my decease all my Stock of Horses Cattle Sheep & Hogs shall be sold under the direction of my dears hereafter named except what will be a sufficient support for my wife and any of our children that may then be single and living with her the quantity of each to be adjudged by my dears -

And whereas from an act of providence my Son John is incapable of managing his own affairs properly I devise to him the sum of One hundred dollars in cash to be by my dears put out yearly for the best Interest that can be had to be applied to his Support both principal and interest whenever it may be necessary also one bed and furniture to be under the direction of my dears for his use at his death should he have any part unexpended, it is to be equally divided between his brothers and Sisters except Frances Woods -

I devise to my son William Delany his heirs forever the

99 tract of land which I purchased from William Atwood lying on the waters of Hartford of Silver-Brook Supposed to contain One hundred Acres be the same more or less I devise to my Son George Delany & his heirs forever Four hundred dollars in cash to be raised ^{out} of my Estate more and above what I shall hereafter give him — I devise to my son Joseph Delany & his heirs forever the tract of land whereon I now live after the decease of my wife Francis Delany —

I give to my beloved wife Francis Delany during her natural life or widowhood the tract of land and plantation whereon I now live — Also what Stock and Household furniture she and my ^{own} may think sufficient for her support and all the negroes we may then be possessed of. If she should ~~think~~ think it right to keep them to be in lieu of Dowers in my real and personal Estate I declare that my wife is not to give security for the property left her nor is she to be answerable for depreciation in value —

Any of our children that may be single at our decease it is my will that an allowance be made them agreeable to what I have given the others in Household & Station furniture before any division shall take place —

It is my will that at the death of my wife Francis the whole of my Estate both real and personal be equally divided among my Children hereafter named to wit William Delany George Delany Joseph Delany Elizabeth Delany & Sally Delany —

I give to my daughter Francis now the wife of Patrick Woods Fifty Cents to her and her heirs for ever —

I give to my two daughters now living with me

Elizabeth and Sally, each a bed and furniture, and am now preparing for them —

On the death of my wife Francis should my Children not agree in the division of my estate last mentioned it is my will that the whole be sold to the highest bidder and equally divided among my Children last above mentioned named except my Daughter Francis — On the conditions therein expressed And lastly I constitute and appoint William Miller and my three Sons William Delany George Delany and Joseph Delany Executors to this my last will and Testament — In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of July in the Year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Thirteen
