1819 the will of the Estate of Thomas Stephenson Deceased was returned
and ordered to be recorded

In the Name of God Amen I Joseph Scott Senior of the County of Madison
and State of Kentucky being in a weak habit of Body but of sound mind and
memory thanks be given to the divine disposal of all things and knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to die and leaving into mind the mortality
of my body do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is
to say I decide and dispose of my landed Estate amongst my children in
the following manner I have given and signed a deed of conveyance to Eliza
Hurby who married my daughter Rebecca for a part of my land which is to be
her share of my landed Estate and likewise a deed of conveyance that I executed
to my son Robert Scott is to be his share of my landed Estate I give and be-
queath to my son Matthew Scott all that part of my land that lies west of
the wagon road leading from Captain Joseph Miller to point back in the
second place I give to my son Joseph Scott William Scott George Scott
James Scott & Eliza Hurby but & Spabilla his wife the balance of my
landed Estate in Madison County where I now live and it to be equally
divided amongst my five last mentioned heirs agreeable to quantity & quality
Joseph Scotts part to begin on Eliza Hurby's Senior line and run down to John
James Scotts land son to John Scott deceased so as to make his part to include
the dwelling house where said Joseph Scott but now lives and William Scotts part
to begin on Hurby's line as before mentioned and run southwardly to John James
Scotts land son to John Scott deceased for his part and thirdly George Scotts part
to begin on Andrew Kennedy's line so called and run southwardly to John
James Scott as before so as to include the mansion house out houses orchard &
spring for his part where I now live and the said George Scott in pro-
ceeding and taking good care of one of my wife Sarah Scott and doing every
thing necessary for us during our natural lives is have for his trouble in so doing
my negro girl Peggy after our deaths and fourthly James Scotts part to begin
on Andrew Kennedy's line so called and run southwardly to John James Scott
son of John Scott deceased for his share so as to include the house where he now lives &
the spring and fifthly Eliza Hurby's part to begin the first mentioned line and
include all the East end of my land for his wife share and I do give each one of
my five last mentioned heirs shares as aforesaid with this reservation that they are
not to sell or dispose of their land got from me to any person or persons what so ever
unless it should be to one of their selves and whereas a suit has been brought
by my agent William Barnett for a claim of land lying on the North of my
home place and should the event of said suit be in my favour my five
last mentioned heirs is to get all the profits arising from the same

signed sealed and pronounced as my
last will and testament in the presence
of us this 21st day May 1816

In the name of God Amen I Alexander Machay of Madison County and State
of Kentucky being afflicted in body but sound in mind and memory and knowing
the mortality of man and that it is appointed me to die do make this my last will
and testament In the first place I recommend my body to the grave to be decently
buried and my soul to God that gave it and as to my worldly goods that God hath
given me I dispose of them in the following manner Viz I give and bequeath to
my two daughters Sarah and Isabella each of them a horse and saddle a bed and
furniture two cows and calves and any thing else they may have made or got
for them when they or either of them leave their Mother then it is my will and
desire that all my just debts be paid and that my beloved wife Jane should have
at the rest of my Estate both real and personal to sell or otherwise dispose of as
she in her judgment may think best and at her death divide it amongst our
children as she may think best it is also my will and desire that my two daughters
above named should have their full share of my Estate as though they had not the articles
above mentioned it is likewise my desire that my wife Jane should be my Executrix
and act as above mentioned herein my hand and seal this 20th day of December 1816
