 of February in the year of our Lord that one Thousand eight hundred and

In pursuance of two orders of the Williamson County Court one made and bearing
 to divide the land estate of Thomas Daugherty deceased in the County of Williamson
 that descended to his heirs agreeable to an act of assembly approved the 26th of
 January 1811 and the other order directing us to allot to Sarah
 Daugherty widow and sister of Thomas Daugherty deceased her
 share of her husband's estate After being first sworn to make
 the following report we find from the surveyors report there is
 194 acres in a tract of land on Lewis Creek agreeable to the
 annexed plat out of which we allot to said Sarah wife of
 for her share in said tract and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at
