In the name of God Amen I Ruhamah Bledsoe of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make constitute and ordain this my last will and Testament as follows (witnessed) (Viz)

First I will and bequeath unto my Mother Mary Dryden all my house hold and kitchen furniture of every description during her life and after her death to descend to my son James (he being my only child)

Secondly I will and bequeath unto my said son James upwards of all monies due me by loan or otherwise together with all the remainder of my Estate both real and personal to him and to his heirs and assigns forever —

Thirdly I hereby constitute and appoint George Spawards Executor to this my last will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Richmond this 25th day of March 1819
