In the name of God amen - I Susannah Noble of Jefferson County of Commonwealth of Kentucky being of sound mind but infirm in body do make and declare this my last will and testament that is to say

1st I give and bequeath unto my son David and Samuel Noble and to my sister Sally Smith wife of Bennett Smith one hundred dollars each
To my son William and James Noble and to my Daughter Anna Nathan I give and bequeath fifty dollars each To my Daughter Betsey I give and bequeath three hundred and fifty dollars all of which legacies are to be paid out of the proceeds of the Sale of a Lot of land in Lexington dect to me by my father William Emmons and I hereby direct my Executor to make Sale of said Lot either at auction or by private sale as he may deem most advisable within six months after my decease and upon a Credit which shall so long shall not exceed twelve months from my decease and in case the proceeds of the Sale of said Lot after defraying all my just debts shall exceed the several Sums which I have already given and bequeathed by this will then and in such case there remains is to be divided between the above named David Samuel and Sally
To my son Samuel I also give and bequeath my ^{horses} Gray and a Gray mare colt and the bed and furniture used by myself
To my son David I also give and bequeath one Bed and furniture
To my Daughter Betsey I also give and bequeath the Bed and furniture which has been used or occupied by herself also my Saddle and a horse and the whole of my house hold and Trulchen

furniture except a Sixteen Gallon Kettle which I give and bequeath unto Clementina Noble daughter of my son William Noble I also give and bequeath unto my son Elijah a debt of two hundred dollars which he owes me for a negro I sold him I hereby appoint my friend Major Robert Calender Executor to this my last will and testament

In testimony whereof I have hereunto Subscribed my name and affixed my seal at Richmond this 16th day of August in the year of Our Lord 1802 and thousand eight hundred and twenty
