and State of Kentucky being weak in body but strong in
mind and perfect in my senses what little I have behind me
I dispose of in the following manner (Viz) First of all I commit
my soul to God who gave it my body to be decently buried in a
Christian like manner all my lawful debts paid out of my estate
Secondly I give and to my Mother disposal half of the money
I have in my possession Thirdly I bequeath unto John Bennett one
hundred dollar of said money Also mourning Harris thirty three
and a third dollar the balance to equally divided
amongst my Brother and Sister Gentry my clothing I leave to my
Sister Gentry and Bennett as it respects what is coming to me
at my Mother death I wish it to be equally divided amongst
all my Brother and Sister.
