the Executor of Stephen Carter an assize was returned and

Elijah Snapp being poorly in body but being in perfect
senses and sound mind after consulting my wife to have
not knowing when it may please my Lord and Master Jesus Christ
to call me from this world after my body being committed to
the dust and all my just debts being paid I will and
bequeath unto my son James Snapp one horse saddle and
bridle worth fifty dollars fifteen dollars for him to buy clothing for
one part of the land I bought from his sister and brother
Re. Howard also the land I bought of Squating Howard

123 to be equally divided between William and Thomas Snapp at the
death of my wife Patsy Snapp I will and bequeath unto my wife
Patsy Snapp the whole of my personal estate to dispose of as she
thinks proper at her death further more I do appoint James Dejeanette
for my Executor and my wife's adviser in the disposal of my estate in case
of my my younger daughter's marriage and leaving their mother
by her consent for her to give them a box or anything that she
soon conveniently spare as witness my hand and seal this 15th
day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and six and ten

produced in Court and proven to be the last will and Testament of
Elijah Snapp deceased by the oath of Adam Butler and Martin
Buchanan subscribing witnesses thereto and a decree to be made in due
order of law

In the name of God amen
I John Dean of the County of Missouri
and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory but knowing
it is appointed for all men to die do make this my last will and
Testament hereby revoking and annulling all wills heretofore made by me
I am first my will is that my just debts be paid by the proceeds of my personal
estate then I leave to my wife Susannah Deane all my mansion house with
one half of the tract of land on which I now live also one half of my house
hold and kitchen furniture likewise one negro woman named Betsey and
her children a negro serving her natural life and at her decease the one
half of my home tract of land and the one half of my house hold and
kitchen furniture that is moved to my wife Susannah during her life shall
thereafter be possessed by my son Christopher Deane and his heirs forever
also after my wife's decease the negro woman Betsey and her children to be
lawfully possessed or disposed of between the children viz. Patsy Deane
Lucy Deane and their heirs forever I leave also to my wife Susannah
one half of the land I bought from his sister and brother Re. Howard
the negro man called Betsey and his children for her use during her life
