We the undersigned Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Madison to settle with Samuel South Guardian of Isaac Starnes heir of Isaac Starnes Deceased, having been first sworn by James Dejeanet Esq. one of the Commissioners called Justice of the peace in and for the County of Madison report as follows, to-wit:

That the statement herewith reported by said South shows satisfactory to us the rents and profits of the plantation from the year 1804 up to January 1820 and interest from year to year thereon amounting in all to 877.66

That a part of said statement shows the expenditures and that said expenditures in future proven and supported by exhibits from 5 to 14 exclusive herewith reported amounting in all to 35.60

That exhibit marked No 18 herewith reported shows the disposition and use of the hire of the Negro man Caesar up to the 30th March 1818

That the widow of said Starnes Deceased was indebted more than of the above named Caesar and that the boarding clothing and schooling of the infant Isaac was furnished for the use of the other two thirds of the said Negro Caesar's services from 1804 up to 30th March 1818 will appear by reference to
