In pursuance of an order of the Madison County Court made at the July Term 1816 appointing the undersigned Commissioners to attend to the sale and return of Thomas C. Bullard her right of Dower in and to the Estate of said Bullard have assembled our selves on the premises and as commanded by Irvine & Anderson Deputy Surveyor have attested to Susannah Forson Cole Susannah Bullard her dower in the land and Estate of said Bullard by proper measures and bounds in the following manner also her dower in the Slaves of said Bullard we being first sworn to with Beginning at a Steamboat Landing at the head of said Bullard's Spring now water up thence North & west to a Stake in Isaac Anderson's line a Sugar tree & white oak marker as pointing thence west with said line to an iron wood and bush on a clear corner to Thomas C. Bullard's land thence

324 Upon the branch dividing said Bullard's land and
that of John Roe with its meanders to the forks of the
branch below John Roe's corner thence up the South
fork of said branch with its meanders to the Beginning
It being one equal third part of the landed estate of
said Bullard also we attest to the said Susannah
one negro boy named Dabney valued at \$500 one
negro girl named Shinnery at \$150 one negro girl
named Lilly at \$175 \$825
It being one equal third part of the slaves of said
Bullard as for valuation of Commissioners
The Personal Estate of said Bullard not yet in such
a state of adjustment by the administrators as to
admit of any regular or certain dividend we have thought
proper to pass by and leave that part to be adjusted
by the administrators when he has liquidated the
debts and credits given under our hands and seals

 of my body and knowing that it is appointed for men once to die do

 and first of all I will and recommend my soul to the hands of all mighty
 God that gave it and my body to a Christian burial all the ceremony
 of my wife and friends and do wishing such charity estate to whom it shall
 it has pleased God bless me with in this life I give and dispose
 of in following manner and form first I give and bequeath to

164 Polly my beloved wife all my whole estate Real and Personal so long as
 she survives my widow and for her to care my children and give to them such
 aid when and as she pleases and if she should marry again my will is
 that she should only have a child's part during her natural life and then
 for if of any thing should be left to return to my dear children and if she should
 die my widow my will is that my children have and equal share of all that
 is left and this is my last will and Testament In Testimony whereof I
 set my hand and affix my seal In the presence of witnesses this 23rd day
 of February in the year of our Lord that one Thousand eight hundred and
 eighteen Pleasant Proffitt

 share of her husband's estate After being first sworn to make
