estate be sold and for my wife to a w her thirds and the
rest of the money to be divided amongst my six children
also to my will that the increase arising from my estate
^{above} before mentioned should go with the above estate also to
my will that the money arising from my ~~estate~~ father's
and my wife's father's estate her after collected by my
Executors and Executor should go to the use of buying a
piece of land and at my wife's death or intermarriage my
will is that the land should be sold with the rest
of my estate and equally divided amongst my six
children except her thirds and if either of my six children
namely Christopher Lillard, Matilda Lillard, Nancy
Lillard, Elizabeth Lillard, Gaty Lillard, Thomas
Madison Lillard should die before they receive their
part of my estate my will is that the money should be
equally divided amongst the rest of my children in
manner as above mentioned also to my will that my
Executors and Executor should sell as much of my above
property as will pay my last debts and the rest to go as
before mentioned lastly I appoint my beloved wife
Dilly Lillard my friend George Gorch and my friend
