 Mothers Death Polly Anderson my 3rd Daughter I Give
 and bequeath a Negro Girl by name Dey a bout sixteen
 years old William Bennett my fourth child I Give and
 bequeath a Negro Girl by the name Judith a bed and
 Furniture Susanah Ruple my fourth Daughter I Give and
 bequeath a Negro woman by name Pigg and her increase
 after this Date Peter H Bennett my Son I Give at my Death
 he having had considerable part of my property fifty
 Dollars to be at the Discretion of my Executors and if there
 is that much after my other wishes if fulfilled to my four
 Grand Children heirs of my Son John Bennett he having
 had considerable Negroes bequeath to his eldest Daughter
 Elizabeth Bennett one Dollar likewise one Dollar
