In the name of God Amen Attest Nathaniel Davis of Mason County and State of Kentucky being very sick in body but in perfect health of mind and memory and knowing it is appointed for all men to do as make and create this my last will and Testament and, firstly I recommend my body to be earth to be buried in Christian burial and my spirit I recommend into the hands of almighty God that gave it and as to such pecuniary state as it has pleased God to bless me with in this world I leave and give and dispose of in the following manner and form: First I give to my son Jesse Davis one grey horse known by the name of Arab and twenty dollars in money to be paid to him out of money now owing to me And my will and desire is that my beloved wife Nancy Davis should have all the rest of my estate both real and personal freely by her to enjoy and without any person or persons during her life or so long as she lives after her death my desire is that the estate should be equally divided between my children viz: Rebecca Elms Rebecca Davis Susan Davis Benjamin Davis Della Davis, my sons John Davis and Silas Davis

my desire is that my estate should not be appraised or inventoried I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Nancy Davis and Jesse Davis Executors of

Secondly, I will and bequeath my bed and furniture I have belonging to my beloved wife Margaret and after death to my grand son who he has Philip Thelby. Third and bequeath to my Daughter Leahy Gips one bay horse Fourth, I will and bequeath to my son who he has White my saddle Fifthly my will is that all my estate both real and personal be sold on a twelve month period and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided between myself and all my children and their husbands or wives I do appoint hereby and appoint John White and David Butler as my Executors to this my last will and Testament as witness my hand and seal August 25th 1818
