In the presence of god I Thomas Pullum of Madison County and State of Kentucky being sick in body but sound in mind and memory than to God and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for men one to die I have and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say first of all I commend my soul to God and then that gave it, and my body to be buried in a decent christian burial in hopes of eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord and having a desire to dispose of the property that God has put into my hands my will and desire is that it shall be as followeth to wit, I have first of all after my legal debts are paid my will and desire is that my wife Jane Pullum shall be possessed of all my estate real and personal during her natural life or widowhood but in case of marriage or death my will and desire is that it shall be disposed of as followeth first I give and bequeath to my two Sons Perry and Eliza Pullum my land whereon I now live on the water of States Creek one hundred acres more or less to be divided as near in quantity and quality as possible secondly my will and desire is that all the rest of my Estate of what kind or degree what ever to be sold and equally divided amongst my four Daughters as lay more both except which I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Watson and I do revoke and disannul all other former wills and legacies before made and confirm this my last will and testament to be unto I have set my hand and seal this 22nd day of April one thousand Eight hundred & four
