In pursuance of an Order of the Madison County Court made at their October Term 1818 appointing Reuben Munday Mitchell Overstreet Isaac Walker and Thomas Watts Commissioners to settle with the Administrator of Thomas Hocker Deceased and a subsequent Order made at their July Term 1818 appointing John Trubble and William Stuby in the room of Mitchell Overstreet and Isaac Walker we two of the undersigned met at the house of Isaac Brauner on the 14th day of September 1818 when we adjourned until the 26th day of October 1818 to meet at the house of Reuben Munday the said Munday not being present we have according to adjournment met having previously been duly qualified by James Dejeu with Esq. we proceeded to make said settlement agreeable to the papers laid before us.
