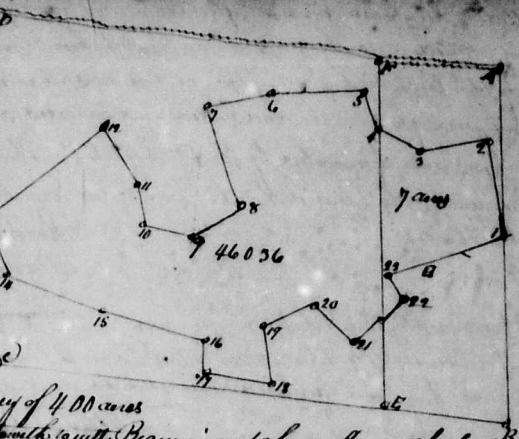

At a County Court held for Marion County on Monday the 1st day
 of February 1819 This allotment of Dovers to the uninclosed and a part of
 William Hartley Survey was returned and made to be recorded

In the Name of God Amen I William Shine of
 the County of Marion and State of Kentucky do make known
 and sign this as my last will and Testament as follows To wit
 First It is my will and desire that the farm on which I have resided
 should be equally divided between my two youngest Sons Albert & James
 if my estate will admit of it for making an equal division and there
 receiving some property besides if not to be supposed as if my Executors
 hereafter named may think best -
 Second I give and bequeath unto my son Edmund Shine one half
 acre of ground adjoining the Town of Richmond situated to the east of
 a lot I sold Richard Thompson being part of the land I purchased of
 Robert Calhoun to him and his heirs forever
 Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son James Shine my estate house one
 thousand dollars in cash which is not to be drawn out of his proportion of my
 estate to him and his heirs forever one of his and his heirs forever
 Fourthly It is my will and desire that my three sons Edmund James and
 Albert (should) I expect this life before they arrive to the age of Twenty one
 years should be by my Executors educated in a moral and correct manner
 until they arrive to that age and they should receive a good education at
 the discretion of my Executors and it is my will and desire that I should my son
 Edmund want nothing to complete his study of the law that
 he should be furnished with by my Executors at their discretion
 Also it is my will that none of the said mentioned sons receive any

 Fifthly It is my will and desire that the balance of my estate (with the)

307 and personally be equally aware between all my children *John*
Elizabeth *John* and *Patsey* his wife *William* *William* *Nathan* and
Amelia his wife *David* *John* *Edmund* *John* *Adam* *John* &
Albert *John* *John* and *John* alike. But I am to understand
 that whereas I have heretofore and intend in this will to give to my
 children some property which will be found charged to them and
 the price thereof in a small book I keep for that purpose which I
 make as a part of this will, It is my will and desire that whatever
 any of them may have received or may hereafter receive before my
 death shall be taken into view and considered as charged
 said Book as a part of their proportions.
 Sixthly, It is my will and desire that I do hereby authorize and
 empower my Executors to sell all my lands lying on the waters of
 Providence back Rhode Island and sell them as they shall
 think best and make Deeds of Conveyance for the same.
 Seventhly, It is my will and desire that my Executors hereafter
 named shall themselves take and Inventory of my estate and
 make return of it the Court which I wish to have the same
 effect in law if it had been done under an order of Court.
 Lastly, I do hereby ordain constitute and appoint *Joseph*
John *William* *William* *William* *David* *John* *Edmund*
John sole Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby
 revoking all former wills by me made heretofore made.
