 my Executors nothing sloughing but at the last day I shall appear
 the same again by the Mighty power of God and as touching
 such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bestow upon me in this
 life I give and dispose of in the following manner and give
 them it my wife and child is that my beloved wife Elizabeth
 Watson be possessed of with most of my estate both real and
 personal and at the end of her natural life to my widowhood
 I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Watson one horse and mare
 Colt and colt. As witness my hand and seal this ninth
 day of February eighteen hundred and fourteen
