1st met on the land of the said Mrs. on the 4th day of January 1831 and promissory lay off the Mowen's answer of the land beginning at a bush in the lane thence North 76 East 63 poles crossing the spring branch a little below the spring to a stone thence North 13 West 58 poles to a stone thence North 78 1/2 East 40 poles to a sugar tree thence North 73 poles to a white walnut on a small branch and on Samuel Barnitz line thence with said Barnitz line West 74 poles to a large poplar the poplar lying down and white ash and white walnut thence South 72 poles with Robert Alen's line to a sugar tree thence South 73 West 31 poles to the corner of the fence and stone thence South 4 East 67 poles to the Beginning containing 8 1/2 acres we likewise estimate the annual value of one Acre of mowen at \$25 per year for which we allot one third of that to the said Mowen we further Report that there is no more of the Estate as we are informed of more than the personal Estate which have been sold and cannot come before us at this time. We the undersigned three of the commissioners appointed by the County Court of Madison at their December and January Term last to allot to Nancy Evans widow and Relief of David Le Borne a deceased her dower in all the landed Estate of which the said David Le Borne was seized and possessed being first duly sworn did on this 31st of February 1831 proceed to allot to the said Mowen her dower in and to the tract of land near the town of Richmond called and known by Barnitz's old station stand in the following manner: Twenty after viewing the whole of the premises and estimating the annual value thereof with all the improvements and other advantages attached to the premises do allot to said Nancy Mowen do all that part of said land lying Eastward of a line beginning at a bush standing on the South bank of a branch of the creek that flows near the town of Richmond and about one pole below the mouth

of the spring branch thence South 48 West 51 poles to a locust post corner of the apple orchard thence with the orchard fence South 55 West 38 poles South 39 East 34 poles North 55 1/2 East 38 poles to the corner of the orchard near the Barn thence South 23 1/2 East 16 poles to the South West corner of the Meadow a locust post thence South 3 1/2 West 70 poles to a locust post in the old line and opposite the corner of Adam Wood's fence at the fork of the lane dividing the land of said Wood and James Baclard and the old station tract thence with the old line South 73 1/2 East to a locust and hickory Roddy line thence with the line of Roddy, Barnitz, Caldwell &c to the Beginning together with the Mansion House, Kitchen, Barn, Stable, Spring House, Washhouse, other Houses and things properly appertaining and belonging to the premises hereby allotted to the said Mowen Given under our hands this 31st of February 1831.

I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Sally Marden daughter of Elijah Marden and also daughter of my daughter Rebecca Marden two hundred dollars in Right of her
