 the Administration of Thomas Collins Decd was turned
 over to be received & the same has been given according

On the 6th day of Oct 1823 Benjamin Whaler of Macdon
 County and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of
 sound mind and memory thanks be to God for his
 mercies therefore willing to humbly the mortality of my body
 and therefore that I appoint into all mine and to
 my manner following words

First it is my will and desire that after the pay ment of
 my just and lawful debts the residue of my property both
 real & personal shall all remain in possession of my wife
 Hannah Whaler during her natural life provided however
 that whenever she shall become unable to take care of the
 estate or shall let it go to waste or destruction in that case
 it is my will that it shall all be sold except such property
 as is here after otherwise devised and for her to have a
 full maintenance out of the profits arising from
 the same -

Second It is my will that after the decease of my
 wife that my negro man George & his mother Grace
 shall both be free and that they shall remain in possession
 of all furniture belonging to their house and that George
 shall have his house & 1/2 acre of land and whereas my negro
 woman Grace is unable to labour for her support that she
 shall have support out of my estate during her natural life
 Third It is my will & desire that after the decease of my beloved
 wife Hannah Whaler that the remaining part be sold
 at the highest price on a credit of twelve months both the real
 and personal property and whereas some of my children

have received more property from me than others, it is my
 desire that their portions shall be made equal according to the
 charge here after mentioned in this will and the balance of
 the profits arising from the sale of the estate be equally
 divided among them and whereas my son Thomas Whaler
 and Benjamin Whaler are both dead I desire that their
 children shall receive the part of my estate which should
 belong to their father provided they have in my and whereas
 that no dispute may arise among my children concerning
 the value of what I have given them I have here a true
 statement of all as follows: Now I My son William Whaler and
 Thomas Whaler Benjamin Whaler John Whaler Mary daughter
 Sally True Mills sister Susanna daughter Sissy Querry have
 received each of them twenty five pounds & 1/2 my daughter
 Selah Burtin has received eleven pounds my daughter
 Wilson has received eleven pounds my daughter Nancy Stru-
 berry has received eleven pounds 4 1/2 it is my will & desire that
 my daughter Selah Burtin my grand daughter Annals Burtin
 shall have per seable possession of the house in which they now live
 in during my wife's life time or so long as they think proper to
 occupy the same And lastly It is my will & desire that my
 son Will Whaler and my son in law Thomas Struberry
 Executor to this my last will & Testament to see the same perform-
 ed according to the true intent and meaning of this same
