Secondly it is my will and desire and I bequeath unto my beloved wife Catherine Parkes my last and tenements whereon I now live together with all and every piece of worldly goods and property that I possess to keep and quiet possession during her natural life and after her death mine heirs she must abide by the provision of the laws of this State, viz) rate and such piece as of her own tenure a widow, during her natural life, my will and desire is what property of mine hereafter in possession at her death should be assigned in the following manner Viz) I give and bequeath unto my three grant sons viz) of my son Father Parkes viz) James Parkes and John Parkes each one dollar and all the remainder part of said property I wish to be sold by my Executors and equally divided between my four sons viz) James, Charles, and Jacob and my son Father's two children that were born to him of his last wife, and my five daughters, viz) Mary, Betty, Margaret, and Sarah my two grand children viz) of my son Charles Parkes, I desire to have an equal part with one in said sale of my above mentioned children, thirdly it is my will and desire that the I leave left to my five Daughters, viz) half to them and the half of their bodies. And I do nominate my wife Catherine Parkes and my friend John Bennett (Taylor) my Executors and Executors of this my last will and Testament.
